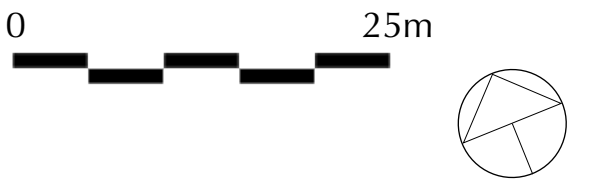

Paddock Tree Positions Revised

Notes

- A.** Arrival Forecourt formed in gravel with grass verges and mixed planting to the sides creating a framework to the house and screening views southwards.
- B.** South Terrace, formed of natural flagstone for dining or lounging with expansive views southwards. Adjoins the Formal Reception Room of the house.
- C.** South Lawn falling towards a Ha-Ha formed in drystone walling creating a discrete boundary with the parkland below. South face of the ha-ha planted with native species hedgerow to enhance connectivity between the existing hedges to the east and west.
- D.** Breakfast Terrace, facing eastwards for morning sunlight and formed in natural flagstone, for dining or lounging and positioned adjacent to the Kitchen. Flanked by formal lawns and mixed ornamental planting beds and with steps up to the Pool Lawn.
- E.** Dining Terrace, facing westwards for afternoon and evening sunlight formed in natural flagstone, for b-b-q's or lounging and positioned adjacent to Study and Family Snug. Flanked by mixed ornamental planting and with steps up to the Circular Lawn
- F.** Pool Lawn with centrepiece natural pool incorporating aquatic planting that keeps the water clean enough for swimming. Surrounded by lawns and broad borders of mixed ornamental garden planting with native garden hedges behind. Filtered south westerly views across the Lower Park
- G.** Pool Pavilion flanked by mixed ornamental garden planting
- H.** Storage area enclosed by native garden hedges with space for bins
- I.** Circular Lawn enclosed by mixed planting and with filtered views south eastwards across Lower Park. Steps up to informal woodland gardens to the west
- J.** Cherry Walk providing an attractive route towards the kitchen gardens flanked by mixed garden planting and enclosed with native garden hedges
- K.** Timber pergola covered by mixed ornamental climbing plants defining the route through the kitchen gardens
- L.** Vegetable, Fruit and Flower Gardens formed with a pattern of managed planting beds fringed by low hedges for growing vegetables, cut flowers and fruit for the family.
- M.** Perennial and Ornamental Grass Garden creating an informal and naturalistic pattern cut through by sinuous paths and mown grass allees
- N.** Existing hedgerow framework retained and managed to enhance diversity and density
- O.** Long Meadow with species rich wild flower grasslands, incorporating some free-standing trees with swathes of spring and autumn flowering bulbs long sweeping paths mown through
- P.** Stables & Courtyard defined by existing hedgerow to the west and new native hedgerow planting to the north, east and south. Framework of formal lawns and tree planting with modest areas of mixed planting around the fringes of the building. Courtyard and parking areas formed in stone cobbles.
